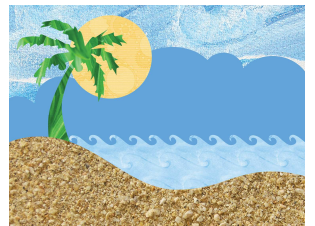
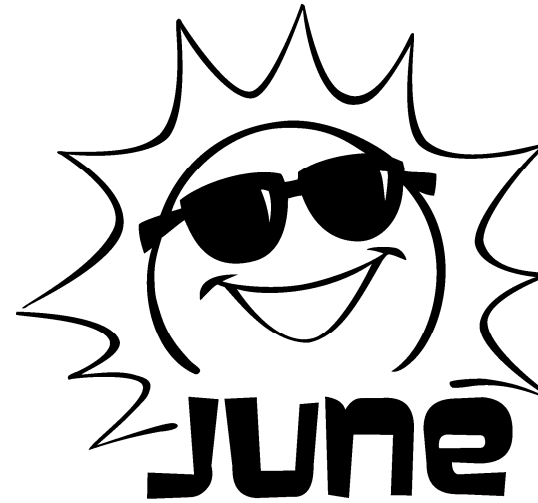

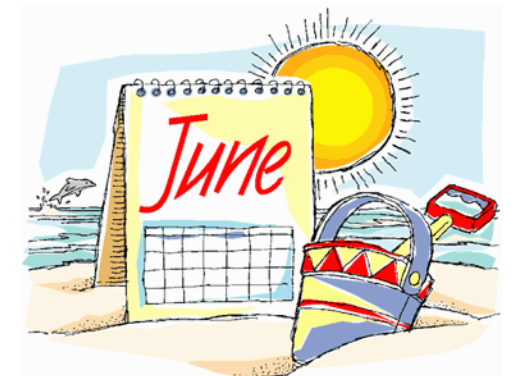

“We hear them declaring the wonders of God in our own tongues!” (Acts 2:11) These utterly amazed Jewish pilgrims from all over the ancient World, heard the Eleven Apostles proclaiming Jesus Christ on that first Christian Pentecost. How could common, uneducated men from Galilee (“Hicksville” in the ancient world) be able to master at least 16 languages, they had previously not known? All of a sudden, people of different languages could understand one another, because the common language was the language of the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit had just come to indwell the Church, as Jesus promised weeks prior: “When the Counselor comes, Whom I will send to you from the Father, the Spirit of Truth Who goes out from the Father, He will testify about me. And you also must testify, for you have been with me from the beginning.” (John 15:26-27). Now, these followers of Jesus, along with the other early Christians, took this Gospel of Christ Jesus deep into parts of Asia, Africa and Europe in less than one generation. In doing so, the whole world was “turned upside down” (Acts 17:6), and all kinds of people came to faith in Christ, and to brotherhood in his name.

In Genesis 11, God had struck down the pride of humanity: the Tower of Babel. In self-congratulating arrogance, the nations had gathered to exalt themselves against God, and usurp His authority. But God confused the languages so the Babel Project could not come to its evil fruition, and then scattered the nations throughout the world. Thus, the human race, separated from God by Sin, was also separated from one another. We lay in this sad estate until Jesus Christ changed everything. “For through him (Jesus Christ) we both have access to the Father by one Spirit. Consequently, you are no longer foreigners and aliens, but fellow citizens with God's people and members of God's household” (Ephesians 2:18-19).

In celebrating Pentecost on the last day of May, we showed that we stand with all Christians, throughout history, on all continents, proclaiming that through the power of his Holy Spirit, Jesus Christ has reconciled us to God and to one another. Such reconciliation was and is an act of God. The confusion of Babel, which sin and arrogance had wrought, is overthrown through humble faith in the Son of God. As we all set aside our human agendas, and exalt the risen Christ, we come together as one Church – one People – in him. In Christ, we understand one another, and embrace God's agenda, as well as understanding one another as brothers and sisters rather than competing nations, political parties, denominations, or other kinds of groups which keep us from understanding one another.

What you do:


1. Decorate the paper with drawings, stickers, etc.

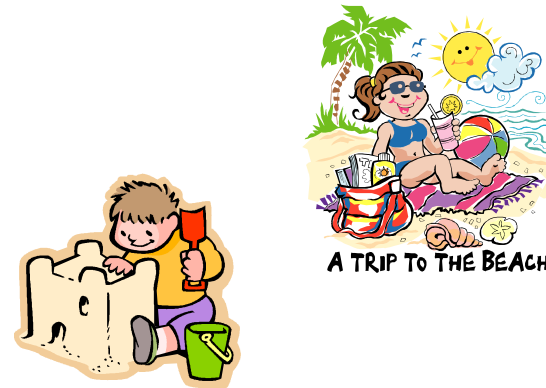
